Bad Lodge News and Some Good Lodge News

The bad news first. Many of you may have heard that our Lodge was vandalized and one week later was broken into. In both events, the damage was minor. The first vandalism was all outside. They stole the Masonic emblems from both sides of our entry sign, kicked and broke the light and mounts at the sign, kick and dented all of the gutter downspouts, turned off the natural gas, and hit the side door glass hard enough to break the outer windowpane.

The next week was much worse. They broke out the side door and entered the building. The theft and damage was still minor. The damage was contained to the dining area. They used a sharp tool to stab one wall, and the TV. They pulled the thermostat from wall. Lastly, they stole the Tiler's decorative sword. The police are investigating.

Now the good news. The break-in and vandalism has motivated the Lodge to improve and upgrade the security system. We have installed security cameras inside and outside that monitor and record 24/7. The alarm system was not activated during the time of the last break-in. The system has been modified to automatically activate from dusk to dawn. We have moved away from the key and code system to a fob system to enter the lodge. We have taken other measures to make sure you are safe while in and outside the building. *The new entry system is provided for general information.* If you have any questions contact MW Wayne Flora.



System Operation - One - Two - Three Easy!

This is for the officers and previous key holders. After presenting the fob, the door automatically unlocks, disarms the alarm, and records the members ID. When leaving - one finger touch and 60 seconds to leave. The doors lock automatically behind you.

For everyone else using the Lodge the system is almost invisible! A zero chance of accidental alarm mishap.
